# Biology and Field Identification of Amphibians

This online seminar will discuss eastern North American species of amphibians: how to identify them, where to look for them, and interesting information about their natural history. Information about migration, communication, overwintering, and reproduction will be included. The seminar will utilize zoom for interactive lectures and discussions in which PowerPoint presentations will be shared. Participants are encouraged to spend time in the field taking photographs and videos of amphibians they find. These will be shared online so species identifications and their natural history can be discussed. There will be suggested readings between classes and chances to discuss those readings. This seminar is intended for participants who are interested in continuing to look for and learn about amphibians in their home area.
