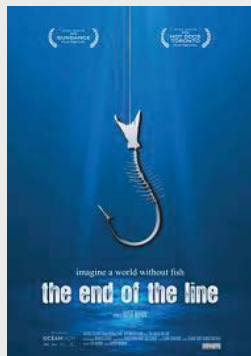

### Friday, October 7

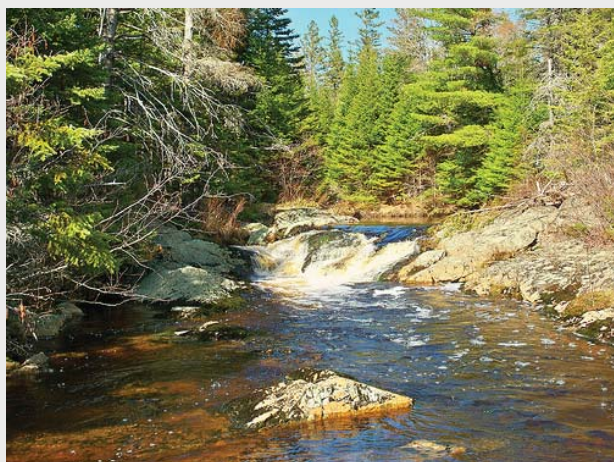
Film 7:00 PM - **The End of the Line** (2009, 124 min)

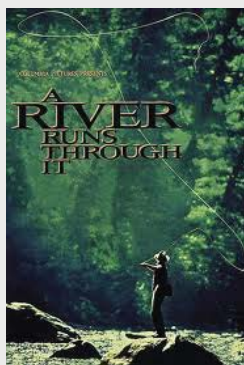
Evening Lecture 7:00 PM **Historic Distribution of Atlantic Salmon** with Jacob van de Sande



Downeast Maine is home to the last wild Atlantic salmon in the United States and may be the last strong hold for other anadromous species including River Herring and Smelts. Fisheries biologist and educator Jacob van de Sande of the Downeast Salmon Federation will give a multimedia presentation on the historic abundance and distribution of Atlantic salmon, the status of current populations, the threats that have lead to their listing as an endangered species, and the work the Downeast Salmon Federation is doing to restore Atlantic salmon and the other anadromous species with which it co-evolved.

Jacob van de Sande has been involved in salmon biology and conservation for the past twenty years starting as a commercial fisherman in Alaska. Upon graduating from College of the Atlantic he worked for the state and federal government doing research on wild salmon in the Downeast Rivers. Jacob did his graduate on anadromous brook trout at the Biology University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, Canada. Jacob currently works at the Downeast Salmon Federation as Hatchery Manager and Education and Outreach Coordinator.
