

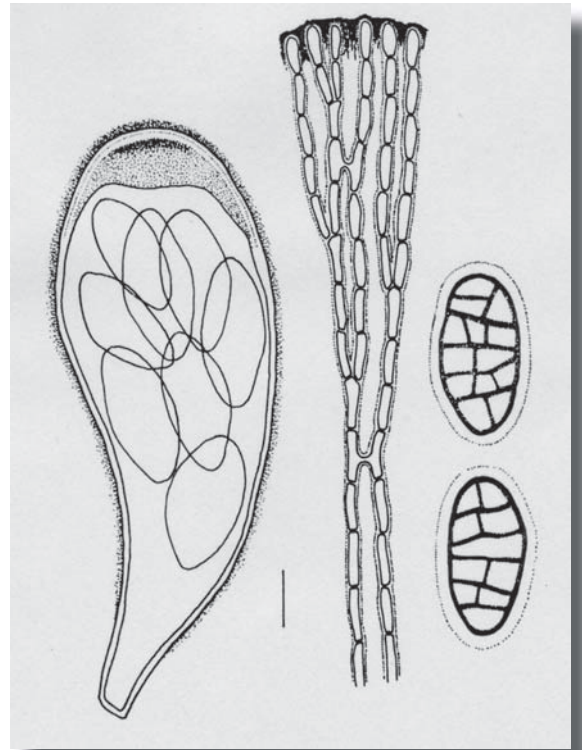
Thursday Lecture Series at Eagle Hill

**Lichens – fungi that have learnt to farm
with Alan Fryday**

Thursday, June 16 - 7:30pm

This lecture will explain what lichens are, describe their various forms and structures, and outline the characters used to identify them. It will illustrate their importance to terrestrial ecosystems and biogeographical studies along with other uses.

Dr. Alan Fryday is a professor at Michigan State University and has been studying lichens for over 25 years, initially in his native U.K., and since 1999 in North America. He has published over 60 research papers and has described over 40 new species, mostly in lecideoid genera.
