Lichen Research Tutorial

University students, and agency personnel and advanced amateurs who would like to continue their study of lichen systematics in a small group (limited to 4-5), are invited to do so with the guidance of experienced lichenologist Richard Harris. Learn the tricks of the trade not included in books. Material to be covered will depend largely on the experience and interests of the participants. Possibilities could include improving lichen identification skills in the field and lab using local collections, work on an academic or work related project, or study of a specific group of lichens. Participants should have taken an advanced lichen course or have equivalent experience (negotiable).

Richard Harris (rharris@nybg.org), a researcher at the New York Botanical Garden, has been working on the lichens of eastern North America for over 40 years, especially Florida, Michigan and New York. He is currently working on a complete treatment of the lichens of the Ozarks and the Mid-Atlantic Coastal Plain
