Tiger Beetles of the Southeastern United States: A Field Guide. Robert Gifford Beaton, R. Stephen Krotzer, and Brian D. Holt. 2021. University of Alabama Press, Tuscaloosa, AL. 200 pp. \$29.95, Paperback. ISBN: 978081359980. Conservatively estimated, tiger beetles comprise more than 2600 species worldwide. The brightly colored and metallic insects are most abundant and diverse in habitats near bodies of water with sand or clay soils as well as on sand dunes, dry lake beds, or woodland paths. *Tiger Beetles* identifies 42 species and 10 subspecies. The book combines current data and taxonomic classifications with stunning close-up photographs, flight season charts, and distribution maps in a volume designed for a growing audience of enthusiastic amateurs and professionals alike.
