◆ The *Prairie Naturalist* (ISSN 2766-8096) is a peer-reviewed journal that publishes original articles and notes focused on natural history research in the North American Great Plains. It was founded in 1969 by the North Dakota Natural Science Society, later renamed as the Great Plains Natural Science Society, which published it as a print journal through 2020.

◆ Manuscript subject matter - The *Prairie Naturalist* welcomes manuscripts based on fieldwork, observations, and associated lab work that focus on terrestrial and freshwater fauna, flora, and habitats. Subject areas include, but are not limited to, community and landscape ecology, species-specific population dynamics, biology, conservation applications, behavior, biogeography, taxonomy, evolution, anatomy, and physiology. Strict lab, modeling, and simulation studies on natural history aspects of the region, without any field component, will also be considered for publication, as long as the research has direct and clear significance to field naturalists and the manuscript discusses these implications.

◆ It offers article-by-article online publication within volumes for prompt distribution to a global audience.

◆ It offers authors the option of publishing large files such as data tables, and audio and video clips as online supplemental files.

◆ Special issues - The *Prairie Naturalist* welcomes proposals for special issues that are based on conference proceedings or on a series of invitational articles. Special issue editors can rely on the publisher's years of experiences in efficiently handling most details relating to the publication of special issues

◆ Indexing - The *Prairie Naturalist* is indexed in Web of Science (clarivate.com) and by way of author entries in Google Scholar and ResearchGate. Its indexing coverage will expand as interest in the journal grows. Indexing companies are well familiar with Institute's first 3 journals (*Northeastern Naturalist*, *Southeastern Naturalist*, and *Journal of the North Atlantic*) which are well indexed and included in full-text in BioOne.org and JSTOR.org and are indexed in Web of Science (clarivate.com) and EBSCO.com.

◆ The journal's staff is pleased to discuss ideas for manuscripts and to assist during all stages of manuscript preparation. The journal has a page charge to help defray a portion of the costs of publishing manuscripts. Instructions for Authors are available (<http://www.eaglehill.us/prna>).

◆ It is co-published with the *Northeastern Naturalist*, *Southeastern Naturalist*, *Caribbean Naturalist*, *Urban Naturalist*, *Neotropical Naturalist*, and *Eastern Paleontologist*.
